

Michelle Cordaro and Jackie McGrath Introduce New Media & Research High School Course

This past spring, the Haldane school community, like many others across the nation, went through challenges due to the COVID-19 Pandemic. As history teachers, Ms. Cordaro and Ms. McGrath looked at the pandemic as a teachable moment for students. In the spring, students created digital reflections of what life was like during the pandemic and how the quarantine impacted their lives.

Students submitted many great projects with poignant insights into teen life during the COVID-19 shutdown. As Ms. Cordaro and Ms. McGrath reflected on their teaching during the quarantine they asked, "how can we engage our student population in a way that connects current events to the curriculum, and has a meaningful impact with an authentic voice; reflective of our student population?"

The teachers spent the summer researching ways to put current events into context, and came across the PBS NewsHour Student Reporting Labs program.

Their goal is simple:

"We want our "student-journalists" to bring credible and relevant news stories to their Haldane community."



Ms. Cordaro and Ms. McGrath will serve as Haldane's Executive Producers working with PBS NewsHour to utilize resources that will help students hone their journalistic skills. Depending on students' success with PBS NewsHour, Haldane may have the opportunity to be featured in one of the PBS NewsHour broadcasts!

The hope is that students have fun reporting the news to the Haldane community and become more well-versed in the current events that affect us on a global, national, and local level. By the end of the year, students will learn about how a newsroom works and strengthen their ability to critically analyze information that is seen in the media, thereby becoming a more well-informed global citizens.
