### **DBT Art Therapy Teaches Mindfulness and Emotional Regulation**

Students in fourth grade participated in DBT, Dialectical Behavior Therapy lessons, with Ms. Curry. The students learned what DBT is and the components that make up this form of therapy. The focus was to teach the skills of DBT to help students in their everyday lives. The students learned about dialectics and the 3 states of mind, along with the 4 key areas of DBT: mindfulness, emotion regulation, distress tolerance, and improving relationships.


As part of the implementation of the therapy, Jayne Henderson, a creative arts therapist, visited the students for a series of 4 lessons surrounding distress tolerance skills, mindfulness, emotional and logical responses, and self regulation. Students explored with senses through a series of activities, created objects to represent their "wise mind," and practiced mindfulness through role playing.



### **Fearsome Predators**

What is a predator? Students visited with a naturalist from The Center for Environmental Education at PNW BOCES to learn all about fearsome predators. They examined the differences between structures and functions, and adaptations. Students pondered what would happen if predators disappeared, and learned the importance of keystone species.


