### **Big Debates Under the Big Tops**

## Haldane Middle School hosted a debate competition celebrating their intelligence, reason, and voices.

We knew the 2020-2021 school year would be unique and present unforeseen challenges. One such challenge was the cancellation of the annual trip to the Bard College Middle School Debate Competition. In its place, Haldane decide to host its own middle school competition on Saturday, May 22nd.

Following a similar format as Bard, students from Manitou, Union Vale, and Haldane debated three different topics: the removal of controversial monuments, a civics test to determine voter eligibility, and banning private cars in big cities. The debates took place under the tents around campus during a hot day, and it was the first time the students debated in front of an audience. All students did a tremendous job handling the preparation, performance, and environment.

Overall, Haldane's teams were very successful, ranking among the top 3 teams of the competition. The 6th grade team of Tess Hereford, Talia Hird, and Una Lentz finished in third place. The 8th grade team of Robert Freimark, Violeta Edwards, and Amelia Alayon finished in second place and the two-person team of Keira Shanahan and Josie Foley-Hedlund claimed the top team award. The top individual awards also went to Haldane students. Amelia Alayon was named the third best debater in the competition. Keira Shanahan was named the second best debater, and Josie Foley-Hedlund claimed the Best Debater award.

Mr. Sniffen was very excited to host this event and provide a competition where intelligence, reason, and voice were celebrated. He is very proud of the efforts all 14 Haldane students put forth in order to perform at such a high level.

Once the 7th graders let their ideas "stew" (as Mrs. Curto says), they are ready to draft their This I Believe Statements in which they declare their beliefs and fortify them with personal memories.

The project culminates with a celebration during which each student receives a published anthology of the This I Believe statements. During the celebration, students are given an opportunity to share their writing aloud and discuss their pieces. In the wake of such a challenging year, wherein social distancing and half-hidden faces were the norms, it was so rewarding to see students connect over the things in life that really ground them, shape them, and challenge them. As the world opened up, so did the experiences for Haldane Seniors who took to the working world to try their hands at career paths of their choosing.


